KNIFE CARE TIPS For All Damascus Knives.

There are some tips for you to look after your knives:

I- After Use: Wash the blade, dry it, apply vegetable oil, or any lubricated oil or Vaseline on the blade and other Damascus steel area to prevent rust.

II-Carbon Steel Will Change Colors After time: But will still perform well. Clean the brass & handle material with Simichrome or other brass cleaner. Damascus is very easy to clean up if rusted. But it seems to be quite rust resistant.

III-Damascus Gets Dark With Age: To brighten up the blade, sand it lengthwise with a worn piece of sand paper. This just hits the raised portions of the etched pattern and makes the blade look brighter. Don't store the knife near water or a wet area.

The deeply textured handle scales are G-10, barely add to the Skyline's weight, and provide for a secure grip. The handle design itself, with its deep index-finger contour, further enhances the Skyline's very secure grip. The Skyline opens manually with a built-in flipper. Just pull back on the flipper and add a slight wrist roll for quick and easy opening with left or right hand. A liner lock keeps the blade locked open for secure use.
